Anointing of the Sick: Those who may be in danger of death should receive the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick promptly by contacting the parish or Father Tebalt at church after the weekend Masses.

Facilities: The facilities and services of Our Lady of Lourdes are available to active members who fulfill the requirements. This includes the use of the church for all Sacramental Events.

FOURTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

FROM THE PASTOR:

This Wednesday, July 12th, is the feast day of a married couple: St. Louis Martin and St. Marie-Azélie Guérin Martin. The father and mother of one of the most beloved saints of modern times, St. Thérèse of the Child Jesus and the Holy Face (commonly called St. Thérèse of Lisieux), the Guérins are the only married couple to have been canonized *together*. In his youth, Louis had hoped to enter St. Bernard Monastery but was denied due to his inability to learn Latin. Marie-Azélie had hoped to join the Sisters of Charity of St. Vincent de Paul. She was denied because of respiratory problems and frequent headaches. Instead, she took up the manufacture of Alençon lace and met and married Louis, by that time a watchmaker. Their lace business thrived to such an extent that Louis sold his watchmaking business and entered into partnership with his wife full-time. The couple had nine children (seven daughters and two sons). Five of the daughters survived to adulthood. Of those five, all of them became nuns. Marie Louise, the eldest, entered the Carmel at Lisieux. The next, Marie Pauline did likewise and eventually became Mother Superior of the convent. Marie Léonie became a Visitation sister at Caen (a cause for her canonization was opened in 2015). Marie Céline entered the Carmel at Lisieux, as did the baby of the family, Marie Françoise-Thérèse (St Thérèse). She was canonized in 1925 and eventually declared a Doctor of the Church. Remember that Thérèse died of tuberculosis in 1897 at the age of just 24. Zélie (as Marie-Azélie was called) died of breast cancer in Alençon in 1877 at the age of just 45, when her youngest child, Thérèse, was only 4 years old. After her death, Louis sold the lacemaking business and moved with the children to Lisieux in Normandy in order to be near family. This was, of course, where the girls became familiar with the now-famous Carmel of Lisieux. Louis died in 1894.

How is it, do you suppose, that the parents raised these children so that all of them dedicated their lives to Christ in religious life? If one reads St. Thérèse’s short book *Autobiography of a Soul*, one quickly sees that there was no secret to it, nor was it mysterious, nor, for that matter, was it anything particularly extraordinary. The parents showered their children with love. They prayed with them each and every day. They educated themselves about their faith and passed it on to their children. They read the Scriptures to them. They took them to Mass frequently and taught them to appreciate and be grateful for the gift of the Sacraments.

So, if you want your children to grow up to remain faithful and love Jesus and His Church, that’s all you have to do. It’s simply a matter of setting priorities. A question for reflection: “what are my priorities, and what I am teaching my children by those priorities?”
