CHRIST, THE KING OF THE UNIVERSE

**FROM THE PASTOR**

Recently, I was re-reading some of the poetry of the English Victorian poet Gerard Manley Hopkins. Hopkins was particularly instrumental in the development of English-language poetry with his invention of what is called *sprung rhythm*. Until the time of Hopkins, most English poetry was based on a rather rigid rhythmic structure derived from Norman French, based on repeating “feet” of two or three syllables with the stress falling in the same place on each repetition. You might recall from your school days, for example, the most common form of this, called iambic pentameter. An *iamb* is an unstressed syllable followed by a stressed one (thus, the “foot” is two syllables). *Pentameter* means that there are five of these feet in a line. Iambic pentameter is used in blank verse (unrhymed iambic pentameter) and heroic couplets, for example. It was famously used by William Shakespeare in his plays and sonnets.

Hopkins, however, became fascinated with the older structure of Anglo-Saxon poetry (such as *Beowulf*). From this, he developed what he termed *sprung rhythm*. A variable number of syllables (between one and four) were used in each foot, with the stress always falling on the first syllable. Sprung rhythm anticipated free verse. Considered as influential as T.S. Eliot in the modern poetry movement, Hopkins was influential on W.H. Auden and Dylan Thomas. His use of imagery and language is rich, and his love of nature is apparent in his poems.

Hopkins studied classics at Balliol College, Oxford, and, while there, converted to Catholicism. He was received into the Catholic Church on October 21, 1866 by another Oxford convert, Blessed John Henry Newman. Following his studies at Oxford, Hopkins entered the Society of Jesus (the Jesuits) and was ordained a priest in 1878. All of his poetry was published posthumously. Two of my favorites follow below.

**Pied Beauty (1877)**

Glory be to God for dappled things—  
 For skies of couple-colour as a brinded cow;  
 For rose-moles all in stipple upon trout that swim;  
 Fresh-firecoal chestnut-falls; finches’ wings;  
 Landscape plotted and pieced—fold, fallow, and plough;  
 And all trades, their gear and tackle and trim.  
 All things counter, original, spare, strange;  
 Whatever is fickle, freckled (who knows how?)  
 With swift, slow; sweet, sour; adazzle, dim;  
 He fathers-forth whose beauty is past change:  
 Praise Him.

**God’s Grandeur (1877)**

The world is charged with the grandeur of God.  
 It will flame out, like shining from shook foil;  
 It gathers to a greatness, like the ooze of oil  
 Crushed. Why do men then now not reck his rod?  
 Generations have trod, have trod, have trod;  
 And all is seared with trade; bleared, smeared with toil;  
 And wears man’s smudge and shares man’s smell: the soil  
 Is bare now, nor can foot feel, being shod.  
 And for all this, nature is never spent;  
 There lives the dearest freshness deep down things;  
 And though the last lights off the black West went  
 Oh, morning, at the brown brink eastward, springs--  
 Because the Holy Ghost over the bent  
 World broods with warm breast and with ah! bright wings.
