Anointing of the Sick: Those who may be in danger of death should receive the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick promptly by contacting the parish or Father Tebalt at church after the weekend Masses.

Facilities: The facilities and services of Our Lady of Lourdes are available to active members who fulfill the requirements. This includes the use of the church for all Sacramental Events.

THE SECOND SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME

FROM THE PASTOR

In chapter 2, verses 15-16, of St. Paul’s Letter to the Colossians he writes, “Put to death the parts of you that are earthly: immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, and the greed that is idolatry. Because of these, the wrath of God is coming upon the disobedient. By these you too once conducted yourselves, when you lived in that way. **But now you must put them all away: anger, fury, malice, slander, and obscene speech out of your mouths.**”

I dare say that in that last sentence, any of us can find at least one thing with which we struggle. I would like to proffer a suggested antidote to the last one in the list. In Paul’s admonition against obscene speech, I would include taking the name of the Lord in vain.

Many of you may know from having attended Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament that at the end of that rite, after the Sacrament has been reposed in the tabernacle, the priest (or deacon) and the people all recite together what are called the Divine Praises. The Divine Praises have been a concluding part of Benediction for almost 200 years. They were not, however, originally composed for that purpose. Instead, the Italian Jesuit priest Luigi Felici composed them in 1797, originally as a means of making reparation for blasphemy and profanity. The idea was whenever one caught oneself taking the name of the Lord in vain, or engaging in blasphemy, or using any other profanity, one would quickly recite the Divine Praises as a means of asking God’s forgiveness and of reminding oneself to be careful in speech.

The Divine Praises can always be found in a Missal or Missalette, at the place where the rite for Benediction is given. But here they are, in case you’d like to memorize them and use them in your own battle against intemperate speech:

Blessed be God. Blessed be His Holy Name. Blessed be Jesus Christ, true God and true Man. Blessed be the Name of Jesus. Blessed be His Most Sacred Heart. Blessed be His Most Precious Blood. Blessed be Jesus, in the Most Holy Sacrament of the Altar. Blessed be the Holy Spirit, the Paraclete. Blessed be the great Mother of God, Mary Most Holy. Blessed be her Holy and Immaculate Conception. Blessed be her Glorious Assumption. Blessed be the name of Mary, Virgin and Mother. Blessed be St. Joseph, her most chaste spouse. Blessed be God in His Angels and in His Saints.

It’s simple: every time you catch yourself taking the Lord’s name in vain or otherwise using profanity, stop and recite the Divine Praises, either aloud or to yourself.
