**Facilities:** The facilities and services of Our Lady of Lourdes are available to active members who fulfill the requirements. This includes the use of the church for all Sacramental Events.

## FROM THE PASTOR

The lemming is a small Arctic rodent, usually 5-7 inches long and weighing .05 to .07 pounds. Like most rodents, their population expands rapidly before they disperse to find food and shelter that their habitats are no longer able to provide. Some lemming populations (particularly the Norway lemming) fluctuate so chaotically every four years that they reach near extinction levels before again rapidly reproducing.

For almost 500 years, naturalists have sought to explain these population shifts. These explanations have ranged from the bizarre (that lemmings fell from the sky when it rained and then died when grass started to grow in the springtime) to the more sensible (predation and the inability of a habitat to support the population). One very popular misconception is that lemmings commit mass suicide by hurling themselves in large groups off of cliffs and into bodies of water. That misconception is so widely held that it has been used as a trope for various television commercials. Lemming mass suicide has also been a theme in cartoons and comics, as the basis for video games, and as a metaphor in popular song lyrics. But it is a misconception. Lemmings do not, in fact, commit mass suicide: they do not blindly follow each other off of cliffs.

The popular notion of lemming mass suicide is perhaps most notably attributable to the 1958 documentary film *White Wilderness*, produced by Walt Disney Studios. So well made and narrated was this film that it won the Academy Award for Documentary Feature that year. Focusing on the life of animals in the Arctic, the movie has a scene of mass migration in which lemmings are seen jumping from a cliff to certain death, drowning in the water below as they desperately try to swim to safety. The only problem? The scene was faked. 100% faked.

In fact, the scene wasn't even filmed in the Arctic, but in Calgary, Alberta: some lemmings were caught in the Hudson Bay area and flown to Calgary. Because the producers of the movie didn't have many lemmings to work with, the scenes of mass migration were simulated using tight camera angles. As for the "mass suicide" scene, the camera crew placed the lemmings on a large snow-covered turntable and then used the turntable to hurl the lemmings forcibly off the cliff into the water below. The crew then continued to film the lemmings as they drowned.

My point? Just because something is in a documentary, or on the internet, or reported by Fox or CNN, or published in a book, or burred by a politician, or written in the newspaper, etc. doesn't automatically make it an accurate depiction of reality. Thinking critically about what we see, what we read, and what we hear is essential.
